MY PARENTS' WORLD – INHERITED MEMORIES An intercultural exchange project on the third generation post-partition By the Goethe-Institutes in Dhaka and Kolkata in collaboration with CSSSC

You are a student interested in history, sociology or commemorative culture? You have prior experience as a journalist? Making short films is a hobby of yours? Then you might just be the right candidate to apply now and become a participant of 'My Parents' World'.

The partition of Bengal is nowadays as topical as ever on both sides of the border. The third generation post-partition grows up partly with idealized and partly with negatively glorified inherited memories.

Within the framework of the project 'Our Parents' World – Inherited Memories' it shall be analyzed, how inherited rather than personally experienced memories shape the image of the third generation post-partition and how they influence their interpretation of history.

Via interviews with the third generation, conducted by the participating students, an easily accessible archive (web platform) shall be created later this year. Experts from Germany and South Asia thereby will help to identify distinct forms of commemorative culture.

COURSE OF EVENTS

The project consists of several phases:

- Kick-off events at Goethe-Institutes Kolkata and Dhaka
- 2-days Workshop on Commemorative Culture with experts from Germany and South Asia in Dhaka
- 2-days Workshop on Interview Techniques with experts from Germany and South Asia in Dhaka
- Interviews with selected persons of the third generation post-partition
- Search for traces trip to West-Bengal and Bangladesh with selected candidates
- Set-up and launch of internet platform

Goethe-Institut will cover all travel expenses (transport-accommodation-visa-daily allowances) and the production costs of the interviews. Honorarium not included.
